II. Approval of Minutes of the October 3, 2019 Annual Meeting

1. President Diane Gilbert called the Meeting to order at 6 p.m.

2. Approval of Minutes of the October 4, 2018 Meeting

Daniel C. Perry presented a motion to accept the Minutes as submitted. The motion was seconded by Peggi Medeiros passing unanimously.

3.a Nominations and Vote for Slate of Officers

Afterward, attendees reviewed displays of wallpaper samples which were used in the scientific analysis of the wall coverings.











Elihu Akin's direct descendant










A reunion of John Akin descendants on the south side of the Elihu Akin House, 2014.



Elihu purchased what we have preserved as the Elihu Akin House in 1769 at the age of 49. He and his family relocated there after the British Invasion of September 1778.

This plate originally belonged to Judith Akin (1708-1800), the daughter of John Akin (1663-1746) and Mary Briggs (1671-1708). Judith is Elihu Akin's half-sister. It is privately owned by an Akin descendant, named after Judith.

DHPT is an all-volunteer grass-roots organization which manages the 1762 Akin House. It provides in-kind services to support the organization's operations, including but not limited to probono legal costs, marketing & communications, website content, postage, forms & supplies, planning, and outreach. Without in-kind services, expenses would be higher, and this organization would not be sustainable. The pending Akin House lease between the Town and DHPT will require more financial obligations.

Jonathan Lane Revolution 250 Coordinator Massachusetts Historical Society

Jonathan Lane is the Revolution 250 Coordinator at the Massachusetts Historical Society. Previously Lane was a Freelance Historian and Genealogist and has prior experience as a substitute teacher at Grafton High School. Lane was the Director of Annual Giving at the American Antiquarian Society for 6 years and was the Director of Marketing and Communications at Destination Plymouth for a year. In his current role with Revolution 250, Lane works with the advisory committee to increase public awareness, recruit new partners, forge relationships with government representatives, and develop a master plan for the coming years. Lane received his ALB from Harvard in 2012 and graduated cum laude with a Social Sciences/History concentration.
